

"Protected" open space lands in New York State, 2006





Key Farmland Protection Policy Milestones

- 1969: Farm Building Property Tax Exemptions
- 1971: Agricultural District Law and Agricultural Assessment (Art. 25-AA, Ag and Markets Law)
- 1992: Major amendments to Art. 25-AA
 - Opinions on sound ag practices
 - Written notices to real estate buyers in Ag districts
 - Notice of intent filings
 - Formation of Agriculture and Farmland Protection Boards (AFPB)
- 1992: Article 25-AAA, Ag and Markets Law
 - County Farmland Protection Planning Grants
 - Purchase of Development Rights Grants
- 1996: Farmers School Tax Credit
- 1998: Article 25-AAAA, Ag and Markets Law
 - Initial Farmland Viability Program Grants
 - Agricultural and Farmland Protection Programs
- · 2007: Municipal Agricultural and Farmland Protection Planning **Grants**

Land area in the North Country: 6.2 million acres (9,700 sq. miles) and about 20% of the New York State total




Empire State Development's 6-county North Country Region

Acreage with landowners receiving an agricultural assessment, N. Country, 2007: nearly 370,000 acres or 29% of total farmland





Agricultural assessments on farmland, North Country, 1990-2006





Number of farms, North Country, 2002 and 2006


